

The meeting was called to order at 12:15pm. State Regent Kizer led the Opening Prayer of 3 Hail Mary's for all deceased members. It was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. Silent roll call of Officers showed Vice Regent Deb York absent. Trudy Pascale was asked to sit in her place. A quorum was present for the meeting. There was the reception of one new member, Laura Kauffman. Regent Kizer led Laura in the membership pledge. Minutes of the last meeting, 1-28-2024, were read and approved as read.

State and National Correspondence—Trudy Pascale read the national correspondence regarding the National Convention in New Orleans during August.

Reports of Circle of Love Chairmen

- <u>Education</u>—Wendy Ruggeri reported that the students that participated in the Education Contest did not follow the criteria guidelines. There were no valid entries. Angelique Ford made a motion that the Court do something for the students that participated in the Education Contest. It was seconded. After much discussion, the motion was voted on and failed.
- <u>Family</u>—Gretchen Zell reported that \$565 was collected during the Pennies for Life Collection. A 'thank you' was extended to those that had provided desserts for the Knights' fish frys. It was noted that under the Standing Rules, Courtesies #8, a wedding gift, a crucifix, was purchased for Sarah Caroline Ruggeri Shirey and her husband, Blake. Report filed.
- <u>Leadership</u>—Trudy Pascale shared 10 leadership lessons that could be learned from the Ted Lasso TV series. It was noted that Ted exhibits good leadership skills that we can all learn from. Trudy's report ended with a quote from Ted. At the end of her presentation, Trudy presented members with a pink box containing English biscuits. (A Ted trait) Report filed.
- <u>Legislation</u>—Gretchen Zell read Connie Boutwell's report. It noted that Bishop Taylor encouraged Catholics NOT to sign the petition for a constitutional amendment on the November ballot allowing abortion through 18 weeks of conception. Several important election dates were also reported. Connie also provided a copy of the Election 2024 Arkansas Voter Guide for members to review and the Arkansas Catholic newspaper (February 17th) with the bishop's statement. Report filed.
- <u>Spiritual Enhancement</u>—Betty Peden discussed the Journey Through Life and the decisions/choices that we make. She encouraged members to pray and to trust God. She noted that pray, reading scripture, and adoration are all ways to bring us closer to God.
- Youth/JCDA—Wendy Ruggeri reported that the Easter egg hunt would be Saturday, March 23rd at 10am. Wendy moved that there would be prizes for the Easter egg hunt. The motion was seconded. After a discussion, the motion passed that there would be prizes for the Easter egg hunt and ways to distribute the prizes would be determined. It was noted that the Confirmation class would help stuff the Easter eggs for the hunt. It was noted that there were only 2 more PRE classes before Spring Break. Members were given plastic eggs to stuff for the hunt. They were asked to return the filled eggs by the morning of the hunt.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS COUNCIL 1153

Council 1153 of the Knights of Columbus met for their monthly meeting on Monday, March 4th. Fourteen members were present. Grand Knight Richard Burleigh called the meeting to order at 5:50 pm and the Our Father was prayed.

Richard provided an update on the expenses and income from the first three Lenten fish fries. Total ticket sales are slightly down from the same period last year, but word has spread throughout the community about the fish fry and the quality of the food served. 50/50 drawing has been successful as well, with two winners donating their share of the raffle back to the council. The Grand Knight thanked the members for all of their hard work at each fish fry and was pleased with the number of workers at each event. The council has offered a free dinner to any new member of the Knights of Columbus that completes the online enrollment at the fish fry. So far, no takers-but some individuals have expressed interest in joining. We were also touched to receive a donation from a former parishioner who could no longer attend the fish fries but wished to support the Knights.

Richard also discussed the upcoming nominations for officers and committee chairs. After reading the roles and responsibilities of each position, each of the existing officers were asked to consider if they wished to remain in their current position. Formal nominations will be held at the May meeting.

The Grand Knight also shared the funeral arrangements for former Grand Knight David Jackson. His family and the repose of his soul were remembered in our prayers at the end of the meeting.

Financial Secretary Leonard Zell provided an update on due payments and status of membership. Following updating of the status of several members, the membership roster will be around 34 members. Recruitment efforts were discussed and life member Eddie Rinchuso volunteered to pay the first-year dues for any new members.

Holy Week: -three KC members were needed for the Stations of the Cross on Good Friday. Adam Smith, Mike Turchi, and Larry Miller volunteered. Deputy Grand Knight Adam Smith read a letter from the diocese Director of Vocations regarding the Holy Thursday collections for the diocese seminarians. We have been asked to read the letter at the masses before Palm Sunday to remind the parishioners of the collection. Adam will discuss with Father Joe.

Leonard Zell presented plans recently given to the Parish Council for a columbarium for the internment of the ashes of parishioners in St. Joseph's Cemetery. The need for the columbarium has developed over the years due to the limited remaining burial plots in the cemetery as well as the move by many families towards cremation. The proposed location may require the movement of a cross and monument to the unborn that were donated by the Knights of Columbus to provide room for the columbarium and to improve visibility of the items. The council agreed to allow for the relocation of the cross and monument within the cemetery, but wished for the cost of the movement to be included in the overall cost of the project.

The Grand Knight proposed to move the meeting times of the Council to 6:00 pm rather than 5:30 pm to accommodate members who lived or worked outside of Jefferson County. The Fourth Degree Council meeting would begin promptly at 6:00 pm and the normal Council meetings would begin immediately after the 4th degree adjourned. The membership voted in favor of this change and those working in the Little Rock area expressed their gratitude.

Under the Good of the Order, the Grand Knight asked to remember the soul of David Jackson and his family in our prayers. Prayers were also offered for David Smith's recovery from surgery, and for Graham Kelter, Eddie Rinchuso's nephew. The meeting adjourned at 7:15 pm and the council closed with the prayer for the canonization of Blessed Father Michael J. McGivney, founder of the Knights of Columbus.


#15 St. Theresa
