On this, the last day of the Paschal Triduum, the Church and, indeed, the whole world is filled with the **radiance** of the resurrection.

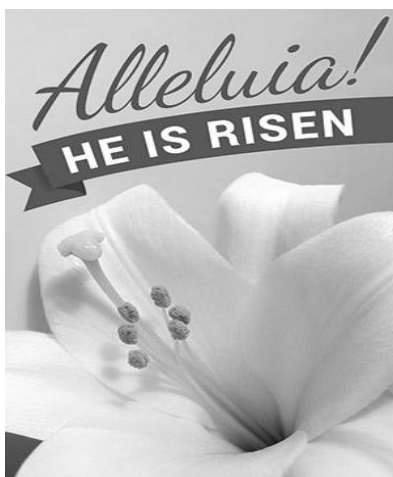
Today, we proclaim the faith passed on to us from the Apostles:

May we greet Christ eagerly through our celebration of Holy Eucharist on this great solemnity of Easter!



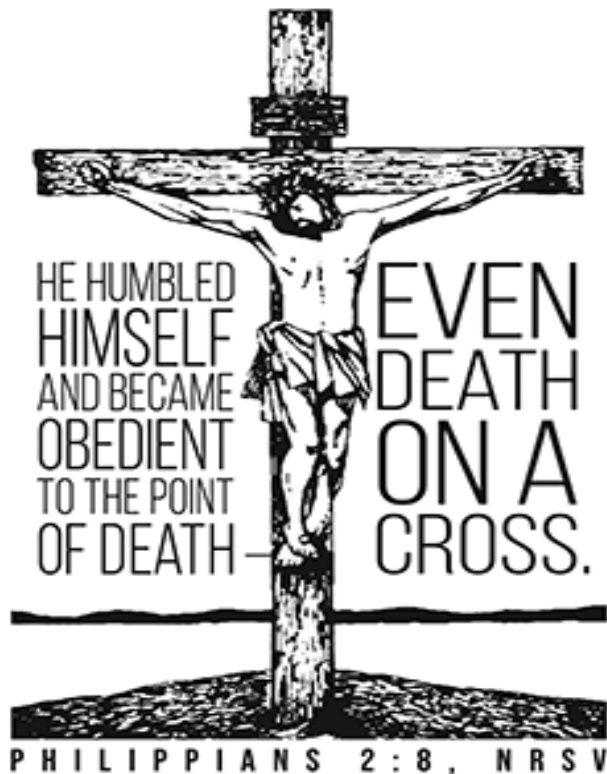

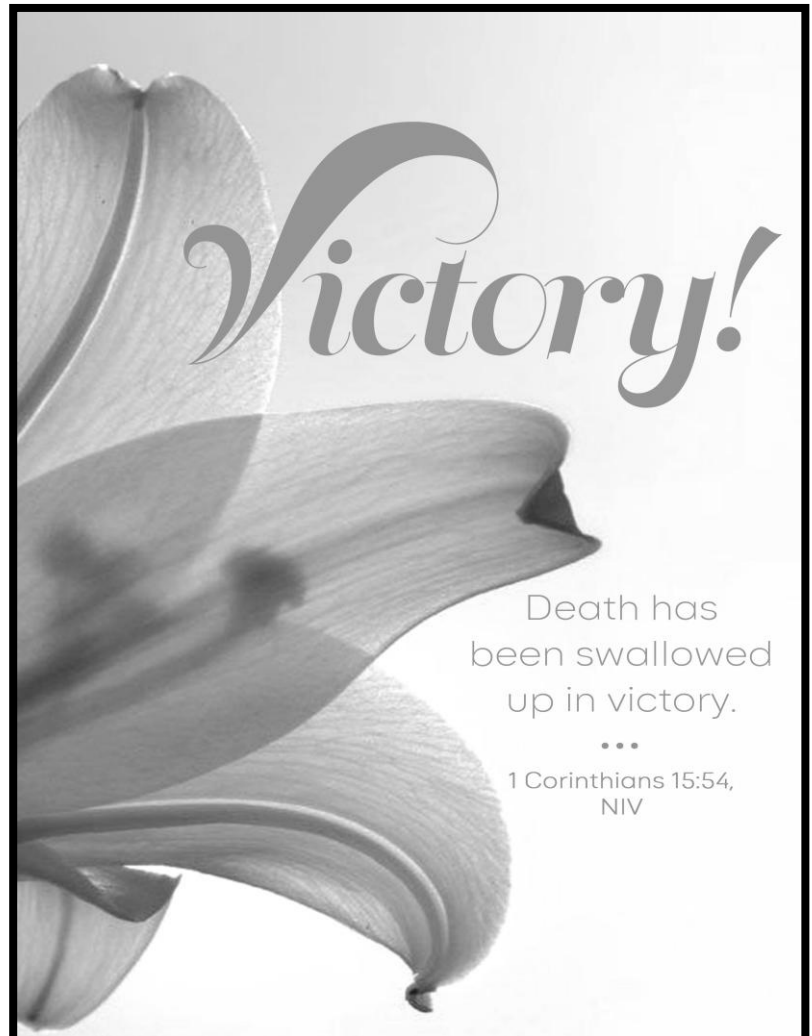

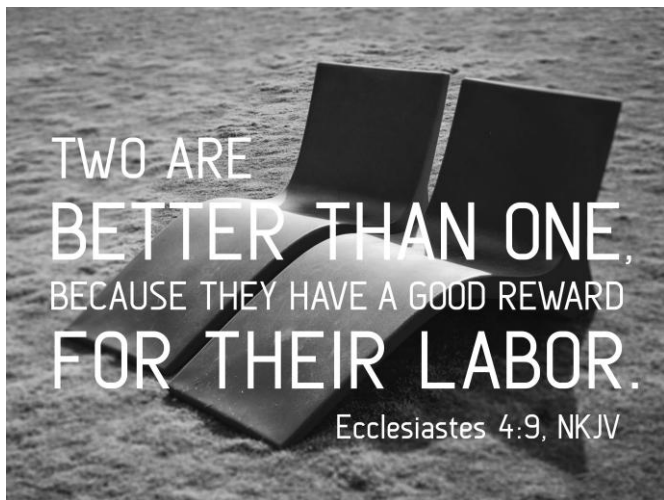

The regular meeting of Court Our Lady of Victory No. 564 was called to order by Regent Mary Ann Kizer. Regent Kizer led the praying of the Grace before Meals. Members were invited to get sack lunches prepared by Vice Regent Deb York. Three Hail Mary's were prayed for members, Elaine McKinney, Corrine Powell, and Margaret Hulse who had died since the previous meeting. Minutes were approved as corrected.

Circle of Love Chair Reports

- Education: Wendy Ruggeri received one entry for the Education Contest but the entry was not on the correct theme.
- Family: Gretchen Zell reported the amount collected and sent to Birthright was \$572.19. She also reported that the National Center of Sexual Exploitation released the 2021 Dirty Dozen List on February 23, 2021.
- Legislation: Connie Boutwell reported no current information on the National CDA website. She reminded members that individuals are able to register to vote when getting a driver's license.
- Quality of Life: Angelique stated the first check for \$100 was sent to St. Peter's Soup Kitchen. 32 dozen tamales, purchased by CDA members, were sent to the St. Peter's Soup Kitchen to serve with chili and cheese. The meal went over well. The remaining 16 dozen tamales will be sent to St. Peter's when needed. It was reported that Kathryn Brickey had made 6 COVID face masks.
- Spiritual Enhancement: Mollie Boeving announced the schedule for Lent at St. Joseph and St. Peter with Palm Sunday on March 28th. Mollie reviewed 3 components of Lent---Prayer, Fasting, and Alms Giving. Mollie said that light weight jackets were being given away at the St. Peter's Soup Kitchen.
- Youth/JCDA: Wendy Ruggeri reported for Sarah Caroline Ruggeri. The Easter Egg Hunt is scheduled for Saturday, March 27th at 10am behind Gallagher Hall. COVID guidelines will be observed. Various options were discussed, such as leftovers from the hunt going to CASA. Member's present were given at least 4 dozen plastic eggs to fill with candy and return to the church office or deliver the morning of the egg hunt.

Unfinished Business:

- 'No Bake' Bake Sale: Deb York reported \$340 was collected for the November 'No Bake' Bake Sale.
- Tamale Sale: 16 dozen tamales were left for St. Peter's Soup Kitchen.
- Pennies for Life, January 17th: Gretchen Zell reported \$572.19 was collected for Birthright.
- "Souper" Bowl Sunday Scholarship Fund Raiser: Deb York reported that "Souper" Bowl Fund Raiser was held February 6th and 7th. 31 people attended. \$310 was collected.
- 100th Anniversary of Court: Regent Kizer reminded members that our 100th anniversary is December 11th. She reported 15 life members are alive.

New Business:


- State Nominating Committee Slate: State Regent Trudy Pascale reported that ballots will be mailed to the local regents. Candidates to run from floor for State Office: No one wanted to run from the floor.
- State Officer's Report: State Regent Trudy Pascale explained the procedures for the State Officer/State Nominating Committee Elections. Trudy said deceased members would be listed on the State CDA website since a Memorial Ceremony would not be conducted with no state convention.

- Trudy Pascale announced that she would be moving to Little Rock; but, would remain active with our Court.
- St. Joseph Feast Day is March 19th.
- Easter Egg Hunt is March 27th.
